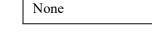

# 6. Governance, Leadership and Management

MDKG College was established with the vision to cater to the need for higher education and to tap the intellectual potential of the women of Assam in particular and the entire North East India in general. - v. To democratise higher education and make higher education accessible to the women of the society.
- vi. To introduce innovative techniques to make the teaching-learning process more effective.
- vii. To develop the potential of the students in extracurricular fields through participation in literary, cultural, sports, and extension activities.
- viii. To sensitise students towards social concerns like gender and environmental issues, human rights, ethical and moral values.

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6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The affiliating university designs and implements the curriculum. However, a good number of teachers of this college being members of the board of studies of the university are involved in designing, revising and upgrading of the curriculum.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The college tries to provide best possible classroom teaching-learning facilities for the students. In order to make the learning process interesting students are involved in methods like projects work, assignments, recitation, quiz, etc. Besides traditional system of teaching, teachers are encouraged to make use of ICT.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examination and evaluation strategies are governed by the affiliating university. The college participates in all such activities under the university wherever required.

Dibrugarh University approved the college as Zonal Office in respect BA 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester Examination, 2011 and the Principal of the college was appointed as the Zonal Officer.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

Since its inception, the College has been encouraging its faculty members for research activities. Teachers are encouraged to pursue Major/ Minor Research Projects funded by agencies like UGC,ICSSR, Govt. Of Assam, etc. The College management also extends full support for availing Faculty Development Programme (FDP) under UGC. The College encourages its faculty members to present their research papers in various national and international forums. Necessary leave is granted to attend the Seminars/Conferences both at the national and international level. Journals and periodicals are subscribed by the central library. Access to e-resources have been made possible through INFILBNET.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The central and departmental libraries have a good collection of text and reference books. Each year the central library is replenished with fresh and new books. In order to augment ICT the following facilities are available:

- Computer laboratory with internet facility for the use of teachers and students with a grant of Rs. 7,47,441/- from the UGC.
- LAN facility
- The whole campus is Wi Fi enabled
- NLIST package for e-resources
- One refrigerator
- Fire extinguishers
- Books for library
- Insurance of building and property against fire for an amount of Rs. 1,57,178/- in this year

In order to expand the horizon of science education for women, the college had procured a plot of land for its second campus for its science stream. The college with a view to starting science stream at UG and PG level in a phase wise manner purchased a plot of land at the cost of Rs. 1,04,97,550/- in 2011.

In the first week of July 2011, the foundation stone for the new science building was laid and thereafter

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The College tries to ensure a congenial working environment for its teaching and non-teaching staff. Frequent meetings of the teaching and non-teaching staff with the college authority are held in order to ensure the smooth functioning of the institution with the active co-operation and participation of all concerned.

- The employees are trained and guided to make them adaptive to technological or administrative changes
- Compensatory holidays are granted when employees work during holidays
- Extra remuneration is paid for extra workload
- Cell to redress cases on Sexual Harassment on women is formed and is operative
- Awards and incentives are offered in recognition of exemplary service rendered by any employee
- Part-time appointment is made to lessen overload of work
- Advance salary is granted to make the workers relieved from sudden financial problems
- Loan to administrative staff of an amount of Rs.1,95,000/- has been sanctioned from Non-teaching Employees Fund during this year

- Approval of selected candidate by the Governing Body
- Proposal sent to DHE for approval

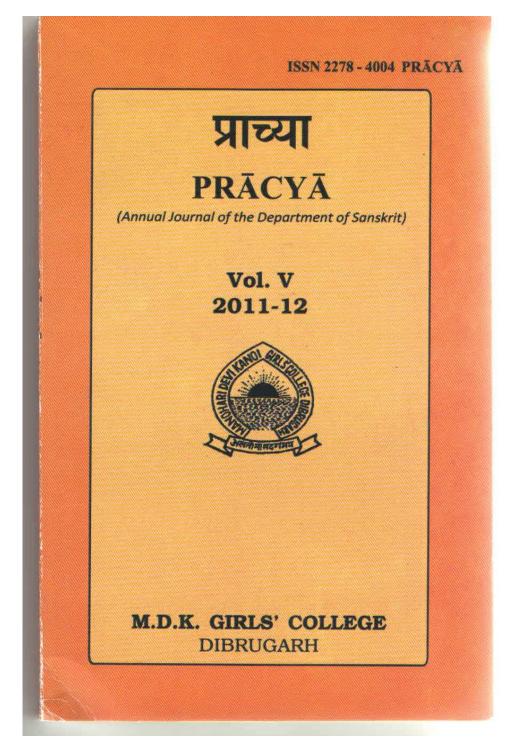

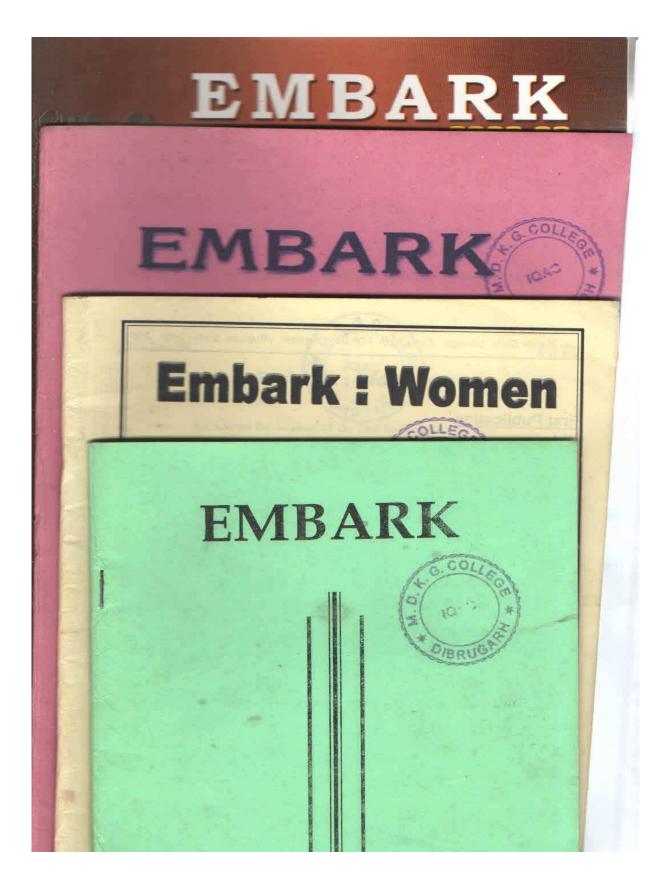

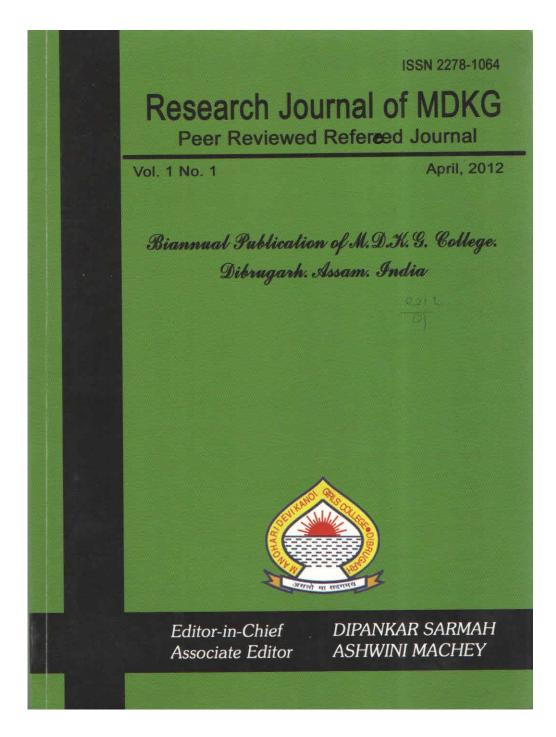
