6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The affiliating university designs and implements the curriculum. However, a good number of teachers of this college being members of the board of studies of the university are involved in designing, revising and upgrading of the curriculum.

Guest faculty are invited to deliver lectures in relevant topics to students. In-house interdisciplinary lectures for students are also encouraged to enrich the learning process in related areas.  - The constitution of the students' Union Body was framed by the committee formed by the IQAC. - ✓ The Arts library is also been restructured for better space utilisation.
- ✓ A committee has been formed to look into the infrastructure issues and non-functioning of lights and fans are being attended to without delay. Moreover, all other maintenance work such as roof leakages, cleaning of water tank, etc. has been attended to.
- ✓ A wooden cabinet functioning as a locker, bookshelf, etc., in the teachers' common room has been added.
- ✓ Under the institutional collaboration, an English and Foreign learning course has been started from 2017.
- ✓ Admission process has been made "on-line". All payments are through POS machines and no cash transaction is carried out from 2017 session.
