#### 5.13 Major grievances of students (if any) redressed:

- Students had opined that departmental libraries should be improved and more reference books should be provided. On its basis some of the departments added text or reference books to their departments libraries with the aid of the annual fund provided to the departments by the college.
- There were grievances regarding the poor maintenance of the students' common room and an out of order fan. Steps were taken for its maintenance and the fan was repaired.
- Where the students complained of inadequate teachers, temporary appointments were made.
- Addressing the grievances regarding the hostel, certain steps were taken by the authority for improvement. The earlier male hostel superintendent has been replaced by an active and energetic lady teacher. A drain was constructed within the hostel premises for proper draining of water. The rooms were white washed. Moreover, at the initiative of the IQAC, the Alumni Association of the college has donated pressure cookers, utensils, water purifiers, etc.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The affiliating university designs and implements the curriculum. However, a good number of teachers of this college being members of the board of studies of the university are involved in designing, revising and upgrading of the curriculum.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Guest faculty are invited to deliver lectures in relevant topics to students. In-house interdisciplinary lectures for students are also encouraged to enrich the learning process in related areas. Students are involved in project works, assignments, recitation, quiz, wall magazines, etc. to enhance their knowledge base. Students are encouraged to use ICT in their seminar presentations. The ongoing teaching-learning methods are documentarily verified to have a feasibility report. Feedback from students and parents also aid in improving the teaching-learning process.

### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Dibrugarh University approved the college as Zonal Office in respect of B.A. examination of 2014 and the Principal was appointed as the Zonal Officer.

### 6.3.4 Research and Development

A Research Committee was constituted to encourage and provide necessary guidance to faculty members in matters relating to research activities. The IQAC distributed predesigned feedback forms about the college and teachers to the respective departments of the college. The students were asked to fill them up and submit it in the IQAC Drop Box. The feedback received were processed and graphically represented in MS EXCEL. The Principal apprised the faculty to work for the best where there were loopholes. Where the students had expressed their views about non-completion of syllabus, the concerned teacher and HoD was asked to look into the matter and rectify for betterment. Temporary teachers were appointed in the understaffed departments. The teachers were also urged to make use of more ICT in teaching learning process.
