Welcome Speech: Dr. Utpal Sut, IQAC Co-ordinator, MDKG College, Dibrugarh

Dr. Utpal Sut, at the very outset thanked Dr. Nibedita Phukan, Principal, MDKG College, Dibrugarh, who has immensely supported and encouraged for conducting a thoughtful webinar on the eve of the 59th foundation day of MDKG College, Dibrugarh. He also extended his heartiest welcome to the esteemed Speakers Dr. Aradhana Kataki (Retired HoD, Dpt. of English, MDKG College, Dibrugarh), Prof. Rajib Handique (HoD, Dpt. of History, Gauhati University), Prof. Akhil Ranjan Dutta (HoD, Dpt. of Political Science, Gauhati University), and also welcomed the participants in the webinar. Dr. Sut has also spoke about the current situation that has immensely affected the entire backbone of teaching- learning and evaluation system. He also mentioned about the situations he mentioned that the present webinar has been taken underhand to discuss how to come over the issues and challenges in higher education, and also to bring new horizons in the system. Hence, he graciously welcomed the Speakers once again, and expected their valuable input and suggestions from different angles over the topic of the webinar.

Inaugural Speech: Dr. Nibedita Phukan, Principal, MDKG College, Dibrugarh

Dr. Nibedita Phukan, has delivered a brief speech on how recent pandemic has created havoc in all spheres of life. Students are deprived from their valuable social interactions, face-to-face learning in the classes and cope over online classes. Teachers too have to update themselves with the latest technology to deliver education to their students. She has also pointed out the New Education Policy,

which points to integrate virtual learning feasible for all by 2025. Student's problems were also highlighted due to the current situation which has affected them both physically and mentally. The best utilization of time has also been hampered. Therefore, on the recent teaching-learning system during the present pandemic, she mentioned the use of online teaching and learning, the use of technology in teaching-learning process. Keeping in mind the overall conditions of the students during the pandemic, teachers should also be encouraged and able to create utmost co-operation in terms of students learning with vital support and encouragement. Moreover, Teachers should be updated to teach in class with the help of technological devices as well. With this she has also welcomed all and hoped for a successful discussion over the topic.

Speaker No 1: Dr. Aradhana Kataki (Retired HoD, Dpt. of English, MDKG College, Dibrugarh)

Dr. Aradhana Kataki, has pointed out regarding the loss of connectivity with the world due to pandemic. The challenges that has been faced by the teachers and the students during this pandemic and mentioned these challenges as a long term challenge. She has also briefly framed out the recent effects that have been faced by students in online learning from the studies and findings. However, she talked about the benefits as well as the adverse effect of online teaching-learning, the disadvantage of appropriate use of tools, unprepared crossover, and also pointed the profit in the time of corona. Moreover, her discussions included the introduction of SWAYM platform for learning also.

Speaker No 2: Prof. Rajib Handique (HoD, Dpt. of History, Gauhati University)


Prof. Rajib Handique, has mentioned Education is transactional not transformational. With this he mentioned various challenges such as: about the structural, institutional and functional challenges, loss of socialization due to pandemic, outcome based education getting hit, continuous evaluation hampered, difficulties in the laboratory work, field work, internships etc, regarding assessment such as NAAC assessment, unable to address the psychological aspects and the mental status are in big turmoil among the students as well as the teachers, problem on how to carry on actual teaching and learning, missing of the soft skills, communications, the use of library has also been hindered, the problems that are being faced due to open-book examination and also dependency on software's may affect students learning etc. However, out of all the odds and challenges, he mentioned that competency has to be build up, focus should be towards better learner outcome, encouraging exchange of ideas in online mode through various contest and competitions, helpline for counseling, integrating ODL, online courses, suggested blended mode of learning with more flexibility. At last he mentioned towards being positive, being ready for challenges and be prepared, grabbing the utmost chance of internationalization (Mentioning Cambridge University where 100% online teaching learning is encouraged). He also mentioned the initiatives imposed by PM of India indicating Digital India towards bridging the gap in this pandemic. However, he has mentioned that there can be no alternative to offline education.


Speaker No 3: Prof. Akhil Ranjan Dutta (HoD, Dpt. of Political Science, Gauhati University)

Prof. Akhil Ranjan Dutta, talked about a distinctive educational system right from its root to the present time situation.
