INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENROLLMENT IN MAJOR SUBJECTS

1. Students with minimum 45% marks can apply.
2. Students must apply only through E-Samarth Portal.
3. A student seeking admission into the Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) programme is allowed to choose a Major subject in any of the earlier mentioned subjects.
4. A Student may submit duly filled application form into a Major Course clearly mentioning her subjects in order of preference upto 3 (three) different subjects for Major Course. She should submit separate application form if she desires to be considered for admission in both Arts and Science streams.
5. Allotment of Major subjects is purely on merit basis; however the process of selection for Major subjects is different for different departments.

●VISION, MISSION AND OBJECTIVES

Vision of the College

The vision of the institution is to provide a conducive environment for teaching, learning, innovation and character building in order to facilitate the creation of an enlightened, just and habitable society.

Mission of the College

- To foster latent talents thus creating a congenial atmosphere for taking up future challenge
- To mould the students to understand the various roles of life assigned to them and be equal in the execution of these roles with perfection

Goals and Objectives of the College

The major objectives of the institution formulated as per Vision & Mission statements are to overcome its weaknesses and avail the opportunities.

To sustain the qualitative academic and administrative standard in the college

The qualitative standard of the academic environment will be sustained by encouraging the faculty members to participate in different faculty development programmes, teachers' training programmes, developing and upgrading the art of teaching. The college will organize different training programmes to enhance the pedagogy as and when needed and demanded by the teachers. The administrative standard will be maintained by providing training programmes to non-teaching staffs on college management software, computer skills, and transparent work culture as and when needed.

To provide education without any discrimination

Discrimination under any ground is strictly prohibited as per the provision of Indian Constitution. The college will never bear any such discriminatory behavior to the students on the grounds of race, culture, language, ethnicity, religion, region or any other areas. Rather it will work for promoting the students of underprivileged groups through UGC remedial coaching entry in service to SC, ST, OBC and Minority Students, setting up equal opportunity cell etc.

To enhance and upgrade research activity among the teachers

For this purpose, the College has constituted a Research Committee which performs functions to promote research activities among the teachers. The college encourages its faculties to participate in national and international seminars, conferences and workshops. The teachers are encouraged to involve in research projects. They are inspired to be the members of subject related organizations. They are asked to organize seminars, conferences, workshops etc. Training programme on preparation and presentation of research proposals, writing of research papers, book/article review etc. are organized on a regular basis.

To initiate skilled based and vocational and professional courses in order to address unemployment

Introduction of vocational and professional courses is the need of the hour. In order to minimize the magnitude of unemployment, the college has the responsibility to introduce some self-financing courses on those areas which help the students to get either employment or to grow as entrepreneurs. NGO management course, Event Management Course, Plastic Designing, Fashion Technology etc. are some of them. The college will make its best efforts in

industry institution alliance, write proposals to state government, UGC and other authorities for tie ups and grants.

To facilitate PG Courses

The College will work to introduce PG Course. In this respect, the department of Assamese has already introduced the PG Course from the last academic year *i.e.* 2022-23. The College will do the needful and write to the University and the government to permit the introduction of PG Course in other departments too.

To enhance employment opportunity

The college will work at its utmost level to create employability for the students. For this purpose, the career counselling and placement cell and the equal opportunity cell will be strengthened. College will work to create an industry-institution alliance in order to facilitate campus recruitment system. It will undergo collaboration with different bodies to organize training programmes, career counselling on different competitive examinations, bank examination, SSC examination, UPSC & APSC examination and other such examinations.



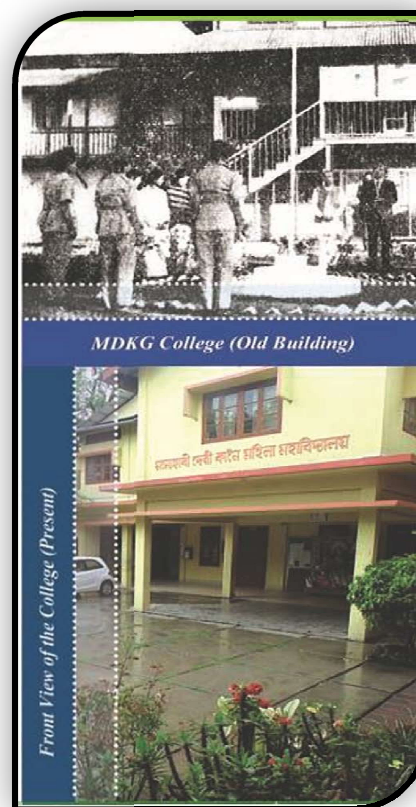
● PROFILE OF MDK GIRLS' COLLEGE

The town of Dibrugarh has a glorious background in the history of women's education in N. E. India. It was in Dibrugarh that the first Girls' High School was established in Assam in the year 1885, which is now known as Dibrugarh Govt. Girls' Higher Secondary and multi-purpose school. Before the establishment of this school, girls had to go outside Assam to complete High School with the help of scholarships granted by the State Government.

In 1945, with the establishment of the Dibrugarh College (renamed as D. H. S. K. College), higher education was brought within easy reach of the local people and many girl students were enrolled. Gradually, the number of girl students increased manifold so that the idea of a separate college for women was mooted. Soon the idea was translated into action and classes were held in the

morning at the Kanoi College premises. Meanwhile, with the collective efforts of many devoted experts having long academic experience in the field of education notably L. P. Dutta and G. C. Sharma, Hanumanbox Kanoi agreed to construct the building in memory of his wife Manohari Devi Kanoi after whom the college has been named. The state education minister helped in the acquisition of government land.

The college started functioning in July 1963 under the principalship of Dr. Jogiraj Basu, noted Oriental scholar. Starting with the total strength of 270,



the college now has an enrolment of approximately 1800 students. The increasing demand for seats in the college has made it difficult for the management of the College to accommodate all applicants seeking admission. To cater to the needs of the students, self-financing undergraduate science stream was initiated by the college in the year 2016 in a separate campus at Khalihamari. M.D.K. Girls' College is affiliated to Dibrugarh University and its Higher Secondary Course is recognized by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, AHSEC.

The main campus of the college is located at Kadamoni and the second campus is located at Khalihamari. As the college campuses are located within the city the college is well connected by roads, railways & airways.

The college has qualified, committed, and devoted faculties prepared to take extra care of students. There are 20 departments teaching different subjects in the college. Apart from their academic duties, teachers are associated with several social, cultural, research and sporting activities enriching the corporate life inside and outside the college. Teachers are engaged in research works like Minor Research Projects sponsored by the UGC while a significant number of teachers have completed their Ph. D. degree from various universities.

Consistent good results, development of multi-purpose potential in the girls throughout the years have proved that MDKG College is an ideal Arts and Science college for women. It takes pride in the fact that it is the first women's college in the district and had done yeoman's service to the cause of women's education in Assam. College takes pride as a good number of students secure positions both in Higher Secondary and undergraduate levels. Besides academics, students excel in the sphere of sports and co-curricular activities, participating and winning at state and national level competitions. The college also has a number of cells and study circles to promote extracurricular activities.


● NAAC ACCREDITATION

The college was accredited with grade B++ in November, 2004 by NAAC. It is significant as it was the second women's college and one of the few colleges of Assam so far to be graded with B++ in the concerned year. The institute had been reaccredited with Grade 'B' (CGPA: 2.9) by NAAC in the year 2011. The College has been accredited for the 3rd cycle and has been awarded Grade B (CGPA: 2.39) in 2018. The college is gearing up for 4th cycle of accreditation.



The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) Govt. of India has adopted the National Institutional Ranking Framework, which ranks the Best Colleges and Universities in India since 2015. For the year 2018 MHRD has selected MDK GIRLS' COLLEGE as one of the best colleges among the 200 best colleges in India. In this year only 6 colleges of Assam are selected and our college is placed in the Rank between 150 to 200. The college also regularly participated in the subsequent years. Dr. Rizia Begum Laskar is working as NIRF Co-ordinator in the college.

● UNNAT BHARAT ABHIJAN

MDKG College is also one, among 35  colleges selected by Govt. of India for Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, the programme launched by Ministry of Human Resource Development. The Project deals with all round development of 5 nearby villages adopted by the college.

● AIDS AWARE COLLEGE

The College conducted a series of Institutional Level Activities and Community Level Activities under University Talks Aids (UTA) programme supported by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India and on successful completion of the programme it was declared as an AIDS Aware College in the year 2004.



● INFRASTRUCTURE & FACILITIES

1. LIBRARY

The college has a well-stocked computerized library with a wide variety of books, text books, reference materials, magazines, newspapers, maps etc. Various national and international journals are available to meet the needs of the students. Photocopying (Xerox) facility is also made available at a



nominal rate. Moreover, there are highly dedicated staffs for support. Most importantly, the library can be used throughout the week during college

hours. Computer and internet facilities are also made available. The library is also equipped with BroadBand Internet Services with five computers to provide uninterrupted information technology. The number of collected resources in the library are: Books-32724; Subscribed Journals, Magazines & Newspaper-24; Maps-10; CD & DVD-50; Back Volume Journal-500; Book Bank- 1300; Computer-09; and Photocopying Machine-1. In addition to these, the library has some distinct collections on the North-East, Women Studies, Gandhian Studies, Performing Arts and MDKG Corner. Moreover, there are two other collections in the memory of late Dr. Vaijyanta Kumar Dutta and late Dr. Swagata Dowerah Bhuyan. The college provides services like Book Circulation, Reservation of Books, Reading facilities for Books, Journals and Newspaper, Overnight and On Site Issue Facility, Reference Services, Reprography Service, Online Public Access Catalogue, Newspaper Clipping Service, Internet Access Facility, Book Bank Facility and Orientation Programme. Library has automated its various services using the software

SOUL 2.0 received from INFLIBNET. Cataloguing and circulation services are fully automated. OPAC facility is available to search the library's holding. The system of Bar Coding of books is also available. All the computers are interlinked with Wi Fi connectivity. The college has a separate library for Science students located in the 2nd campus of the college. Library has established a digital library (Institutional Repository) using DSPACE digital Library Software.

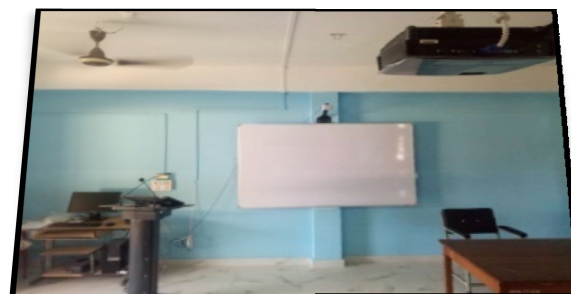
2. CLASS ROOMS

Full attention has been given to create a healthy environment for study by having spacious, clean, and airy classrooms. In addition, some of the classrooms are equipped with LCD power point projectors.



3. SMART CLASS ROOM

The college has recently installed three smart classrooms (two in new building) to cater to the growing needs of teaching & learning pedagogy. Proper attention has been paid to use the ICT in the teaching process. The rooms are equipped with Computers, PowerPoint Projector, digital board, lectern, and seating facilities.



4. GIRLS' COMMON ROOM

A common room for girls has been provided in each of the campuses for relaxation and recreation of students during off periods. Various indoor games like carom, Ludo, Table Tennis etc. are also provided.



5. LABS

The college has well equipped laboratories in the departments of Geography, Home Science, and Education. The college has one language lab and one computer lab in the 1st campus and one ICT lab in the 2nd campus. In the Science block, modern laboratories for Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, Physics and Zoology have been set up. The college campus is connected with Wi Fi services.



6. HOSTEL

The College has two hostels at present for the students. One is at Graham Bazar and another one is attached to the 2nd campus of the college. For admission to the hostel, a candidate should apply formally in the prescribed form made available with the prospectus. Seat allotment is made strictly on the basis of merit and availability of seats. Statutory reservation is also applicable in case of allotment of hostel seats. Hostel is governed by the hostel rules. Every possible care is taken to maintain discipline and punctuality and check irregularities and unbecoming affairs in the hostel. Violating of hostel

rules in any manner shall be liable to punishment which may even lead to expulsion from hostel and college as well. Banani Das is the hostel superintendent.

7. AUDITORIUM & CONFERENCE ROOM

The college has a modern and spacious auditorium with multimedia facility for all kinds of cultural and academic functions. Sound proofing, installation of ceiling fan, LCD Power point projector, adjuster fan etc. facilities are available in the auditorium hall. At the 2nd campus, the college has an ultra-modern conference room with all types of facilities.



8. GYMNASIUM

The college has a modern gymnasium for the use of students furnished with modern fitness equipment. It helps the students to maintain their physical fitness.



9. UGC NETWORKING RESOURCE CENTRE

The College has established this centre with a financial grant from the U.G.C. to provide continuous Internet Surfing facility to the teachers and students at a nominal rate.

10. COLLEGE CANTEEN

The College has two well equipped canteens for students, teachers, and other employees where healthy and non-spicy food is provided. It is a pleasant hangout for



interaction among all the members of the college.

11. EXCURSION & FIELD STUDY TOUR

Field Study Tours are organized by some departments as part of their curriculum. Apart from this, many departments have also organized department level picnics and visits. The students of the college also go for excursions to different places of the country regularly.

12. INDUCTION PROGRAMME OF NEW STUDENTS

Induction programme is organized for Degree freshers at the beginning of the academic session in which the students are made familiar with the different aspects of the college like college layout, rules and regulations, plans and programmes, co-curricular activities etc. The students' union also is given an orientation by the lecturers and administrative authority to carry out their work in a disciplined manner. Moreover, similar kind of orientation is given to the new comers at library where they are made familiar with the library rules, book circulation etc. regulations, library facilities, resources and services.

13. WALL MAGAZINE AND COLLEGE MAGAZINE

Most of the departments publish wall magazines to offer opportunities for the development of the creative talent of the students. A college magazine is also released annually edited by the college magazine secretary and guided by the members of the magazine committee. This magazine basically emphasizes on literary flair & designing graphics of students in Assamese, Bengali, Hindi, and English languages. Gender Sensitization & Sexual Harassment Complaint Cell also publishes a wall magazine titled Uddipana annually.

14. SPORTS FACILITIES

Some indoor game facilities like Table Tennis, Badminton etc. are provided. Sometimes coaching by a recognized coach is arranged. Students excelling in Inter-college tournaments and other sporting events are felicitated in the last day of the week long cultural bonanza held in the college.

15. PHOTOCOPYING FACILITY

For the greater interests of the students and teachers and other staff of the institute, photocopying facility is made available in the central library of the college at a nominal rate. This facility is also offered to the external visitors of the library.

16. ELECTRICITY AND POWER BACKUP

The electricity connection is available at the college campus. Recently the institute has installed one 100 KW transformer at its first campus and another 200 KW transformer in the 2nd campus. For the non-disruption of 24 hours



electricity supply at campus, the college has also installed three generators.

17. WATER SUPPLY

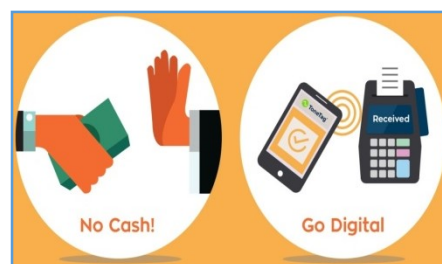
Twenty-four hours of safe drinking water supply is made available in the college premises by installing water coolers, KENT PERK Mineral RO Water Purifiers and Aqua guards.

18. PUBLICATION

Department of Sanskrit, of the college publishes an annual journal titled, Pracya (ISSN 2278-1064). The journal is listed in UGC Care list Group I. The Cell for Women's Studies and Development also publishes an ISSN journal named Embark biennially. A few departments also publish journals on their respective subjects periodically.

19. CASHLESS TRANSACTION (CT)

As Government of India is taking utmost care for less cash transactions with an aim to bring transparency in financial activities, MDKG College is also stepping forward to embrace this initiative. For this purpose, swipe machines have been installed and all cash windows have been closed. All kinds of fees have been paid either through point of sale (swipe machine) or net banking or students can log on to the college website for any kind of payment. A mobile app has also been designed for this purpose which is available at the college website.



20. VIRTUAL COMMUNICATION (VC)

MDKG College gives preference to virtual communication than conventional modes. Any kind of communication with the students has been made through SMS, teachers and non-teaching staffs are communicated either through SMS or through e-mail. For this purpose, a database has been prepared and maintained. Therefore, it is



very strongly recommended that while filling up the ONLINE admission form, utmost care should be given for entering correct mobile number and valid & active email ID. Any kind of change in mobile number or email id should be communicated to the office immediately for updating the database. All candidates are advised not to upload other's email id and mobile number but rather they should open an email account on any one of the virtual platforms.

21. ONLINE ADMISSION



Like the preceding academic years, MDKG College goes with a fully automated online admission procedure this year. Interested candidates can log on the college website (www.mdkgcollege.edu.in), read the prospectus very carefully and then fill up the ONLINE admission form with accurate data and information and then upload the prescribed documents either in PDF or JPEG format. Date of admission will be notified on the college website in the NOTICE panel.

22. FEED BACK

The college is always working for quality enhancement and improvement. For this purpose the IQAC regularly collects feedback from students and guardians. To work more excellently in this regard, the IQAC has initiated to collect feedback from the teachers, non-teaching staff and alumni. Continuous and comprehensive evaluation is an integral part of the semester system. Although the teachers of this institute dedicatedly take utmost care for the students but yet the institute has identified some cases of slow learning.

24. MENTORING PROCESS

The College has started a process of Mentoring for students. Students of each semester are divided into groups and assigned to a particular teacher who acts as a Mentor for the students.



Students are the real assets of any educational institution. MDKG College is always trying its best for the overall development of the students. For this purpose, the institute in general and different cell and committees in particular has organized multi-dimensional programmes, events and sessions. Apart from these, the college is presently offering support to the students in different ways.

1. STUDENTS' UNION

Every year a students' union is formed as per their constitution to promote welfare of the students and to look after the matters related to the interest of the student community. The Students' Union is an organization recognized by the college authority. The office bearers of the union are elected annually by students. The seven day annual sports and cultural bonanza (college week) is held under the auspices of the students union. However, secretaries and the

union body will function under the guidance of the teachers and the college authority.

2. STUDENTS' EDUCATIONAL AID FUND

The college has a Students' Educational Aid Fund to provide financial assistance to the needy students in some special cases. A committee, after making due investigation, confirms the genuineness of the applicant and make necessary arrangement for release of a certain amount depending on the availability of funds. The basis for selection is economically backward but academically brilliant students.

3. BEST TEACHER AWARD

College conferred the best teacher award based on feedback received from students and the teacher's response to the feedback for further enhancement in the teaching-learning process. This award has been conferred for the academic year *i.e.* 2022-23 to Dr. Moutusi Bagchi, Associate Professor and HoD, Department of Geography.

4. BEST DEPARTMENT AWARD

College conferred the best department award in three categories based on academic, co-curricular, and academic and co-curricular activities last academic year. ● CELLS & COMMITTEES

1. INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CEI ~~CEI~~ IQAC

As mentioned by the UGC in its XII plan guidelines, maintaining the momentum of quality consciousness is crucial in colleges. IQAC, in fact, is conceived as a mechanism to build and ensure a culture of quality at the

The college has also a Psychological Committee to support the students in maintain of their mental health and well being.

4. NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

Students can opt for NCC during their course of study at the college. NCC training makes them disciplined and devoted citizens. The organization works towards nation building, national integration, developing self-confidence, and standardizing human qualities of a cadet. By joining NCC, one can appear in 'B' & 'C' certificate examination. Since the year of its inception, the NCC unit of the college has been displayed praise-worthy and exemplary achievements by actively participating in different programmes like Republic Day Parade in New Delhi and other events of sports. 5. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

NSS is an organization that helps the students to develop their personalities and to broaden their outlook through mass contact and community service. The NSS wing of this college was opened in 1996 and it has been actively functioning and participating in various health camps and representing Dibrugarh University in the month long Republic Day Parade camp held in New Delhi. 14. OBC/MOBC/SC/ST/MINORITY CELL

As per UGC guidelines, a cell namely OBC/MOBC/SC/ST/Minority Cell has been constituted by the college with an aim to provide all kinds of assistance to the students belonging to these communities. Presently, Puspa Gaonkhowa, Assistant Professor of Department of Sanskrit is the coordinator of this cell.

15. HEALTH AND SANITATION CLUB (HSC)

As per the guidelines of Dibrugarh University, a Health and Sanitation Club has been constituted with the aim to create mass awareness on cleanliness, health and sanitation. As a consequence of the activities and programmes initiated by this club, Dibrugarh District Administration had declared a Gaon Panchayat namely Phukanarkhat as Open Defecation Free (ODF) GP in the district in the month of March, 2017. Presently, Dr. Ashwini Machey is the College Nodal Officer of this club.

16. ACTA MDKG COLLEGE TEACHERS' UNIT

Assam College Teachers' Association is an academic and intellectual organization of the state established in the year 1949. As per the spirit of the constitution of ACTA, MDKG College also formed its unit called MDKG College Teachers' Unit, ACTA which is affiliated to its parent body.

17. LIBRARY ADVISORY COMMITTEE (LAC)

The college has two libraries, one at its old campus and another at new campus. To run the library smoothly and also to oversee all the aspects of the

library, a Library Advisory Committee has been constituted. The librarian Jadavjyoti Saikia is the secretary of LAC.

18. BOOK CLUB (BC)

Book Club was established under the initiative of the college librarian Jadavjyoti Saikia with an aim to create awareness on book reading among students and teaching communities of the college. The Club initiated a number of steps for achieving its goal by organizing analytical reviews of books, discussion on a specific book etc.

20. CELL FOR INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (IPR): A cell for Intellectual Property Right (IPR) has been formed in MDKG College to look after the activities related to the intellectual property of the college and also to create awareness among faculty and students of the college. Dipankar Sarmah is the co-ordinator of the cell.

21. SPORTS ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE: This committee is formed to look after the sports activities of the students. Utpal Gogoi is the coordinator of this committee.

22. ECO CLUB: ECO club was started to make students aware about our environment and its preservation. Dr. Mitali Sonowal is working as the coordinator of this club.

23. INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE (ICC): The institution adheres to the UGC directive of deterring Sexual Harassment and for this purpose there is a Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) in the college to prevent discrimination and Sexual Harassment against girls by promoting gender amity among students and employees. Dr. Anita Sharma is the coordinator of the committee.

● **New Initiatives**

MDKG College is continuously working towards the up gradation and development of its academic environment, infrastructure, teaching-learning pedagogy, communication system and overall composite mechanism. This year the following initiatives are undertaken for greater benefit of the institute.

1. COLLABORATION:

- The College has signed an MoU with Koushik Foundational Centre of Dibrugarh in 2022, which was formerly CEC with whom college signed an MoU in 2019. They are providing Computer Education to the students.
- The College has signed an MoU with Gratia Technology Private Limited, Guwahati in November, 2022 to provide IT support.
- An MoU was signed with District Industries & Commerce Centre, Dibrugarh in April, 2023 to provide students with entrepreneurship and business ideas.

- The Computer Science department has MoU with Tinsukia College and Bengali department with DCB Girls' College for faculty exchange programme. Department of Economics has MoU with Gargaon College.

2. Adopted Village Project:

College has adopted Nagakhelia Gaon on December, 2020 for socio-economic development support to the village. Utpal Gogoi has been working as the Chief Co-ordinator of this Project. Various programmes have been undertaken by NSS, Women's Cell, PTA, Research, Innovations and Extension Cell for development of the village including establishing a children's library in the village.

3. Sanchay aru Rindan Samabai Samiti Limited:

A welfare society under the name "Manohari Devi Kanoi Girls' College Sanchay aru Rindan Samabai Samiti Limited" has been constituted in February, 2021 for welfare of the teaching and office-staff members of the College. Dr. Shekhar Chakraborty and Shekhar Purkayastha have been working as the secretary and the president of the Samabai Samiti Limited respectively.

4. Museum:

A museum has been set up in the college premises on 5th July, 2021 on the day of 59th Foundation Day of the College to show care the collection of original materials associated with the college.

7. Vermicompost Project:

College's Vermicompost project has been set up in July, 2021 in the science block under the guidance of the department of Botany.

8. Library Activity

Library has made an introductory video on new arrival of books in November, 2022 for publicity. MDKG College has initiated live reading programme from MDKG College library from 1st February, 2023. It is a regular programme and will continue in all the weekdays at 12.30 pm, in front of the library to attracts students for reading.

9. Students' Club

There are 3 (three) student's club in the college – literary, cultural, and sports. Students have to mandatorily be member of any one of the clubs for the next 2 semesters. They can join any other club after 1 year (2 Semesters).

● ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission to college is strictly on merit. There is provision for reservation of seats for students belonging to Reserved Categories as per Govt. rules on submission of certificates from competent authority. A few seats allotted on special consideration to students with outstanding performances in the field of sports, culture, NSS and NCC. Seats have also been reserved for the disabled. A list of the provisionally selected candidates will be prepared by the admission committee after thorough scrutiny of the forms and documents. A copy of the provisionally selected list will be displayed on the notice board. On the date of admission, the candidates will have to appear before the interview committee. They will have to produce all original documents before the committee. Soon after the selection prescribed payment will have to be made by Debit/Credit Card/Net Banking. On the other hand, those who had exhibited their talent either at State Level or at District Level are given 75% and 50% concession on Admission Fees respectively. In case any seat remains vacant owing to cancellation or forfeiture of seat of a selected candidate, the

same will be filled up from the candidates in the waiting list. However, seat for candidates from waiting list is not guaranteed.

CANCELLATION OF SEATS

- (i) A Candidate shall forfeit her seat if admission is not taken on the specific date.
- (ii) A student shall also forfeit the seats if she fails to attend classes without valid ground and permission of the authority for consecutive 15 days from the commencement of the classes.
- (iii) The name of the students shall also be struck off the rolls if she is admitted to an equivalent course under any other college/institution affiliated to Dibrugarh University during the academic session in which she is admitted to.

●GENERAL RULES& INTERNAL EXAMINATION

Attendance: A student needs to attend minimum 80% of classes during an academic session failing to do so she may be penalized and not to be considered to sit at the examination.

College Uniform: Student shall have to wear White Churidar with Orange Border and Dopatta as College uniform. They can also wear white Saree or Mekhla Chadar with Orange Border. However informal dress is permitted to wear during college festivals.

Identity Card and Badge: Identity Card and Badge are to be collected from the Office at the time of admission. The students must carry identity card duly signed by the Principal and College Badge while coming to the college. They must produce I-Cards as and when required.

Rules for maintaining discipline in campus: Every possible care is taken to maintain discipline in the college. A students admitted to this college must abide by the rules and regulations laid down by the college authority. Violation of rules, irregular attendance, showing discourtesy to teacher, in any form, adopting unfair means in examinations will be treated as serious offence. Activities such as initiation of ragging which lower human dignity, use of vulgar language or resorting to violence in any form is strictly prohibited. Students found guilty of such activities will be suspended or expelled from college. Use of Mobile Phone inside the College Campus is strictly prohibited and the College Authority will not entertain any complain regarding loss of Mobiles or other valuables. Organizations recognized by the College authority can avail the facilities of the college premises. All notices desired to be pasted or circulated will have to be countersigned by the

Principal. A Disciplinary-Committee comprising of teachers looks after the maintenance of discipline in the Campus.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION

Unit Test is held regularly. The college holds terminal and Test examinations. The department also hold regular weekly/fortnightly/monthly test. University Examinations are conducted as per provisions of Examination ordinance and the schedule announced by the Dibrugarh University.

Internal Assessment: For the Regular Students, there shall be Internal Assessment in each theory paper of more than 60 marks which shall be conducted as per guidelines of Dibrugarh University. Marks secured by the candidate in Internal Assessment of a paper shall be added to the marks secured in that paper of the Final University Examination. The marks allotted for Internal Assessment in each theory paper shall be based on the following.

- i) Attendance
- ii) Sessional Examination conducted by the College
- iii) Group Discussion/Seminar etc.
